Two young immigrant "Dreamers" will tell their life stories and the devastating impacts faced by the immigrant community. First Church member and attorney Peter Tracey also will describe the disturbing recent changes he has seen in federal immigration courts where he volunteers to represent immigrants. We'll also share resources on how you can help in this important civil rights struggle.

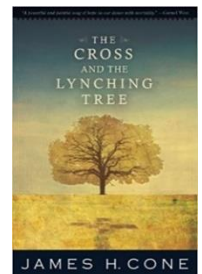


Missionary History into the 21st Century: Adult Nurture on June 17 following Worship
