


Annual Reports due January 4, 2019

January 2019 Second Sunday Offering

The Second Sunday offering on January 13, 2019 will be divided between Seabury's Age-In-Place program and Show Up for Racial Justice (SURJ). All the loose offering in the plate on January 13, 2019 will be divided between these two programs.

Seabury Age-In-Place Program

Having a healthy, safe, and comfortable place to call home is important for all of us. Seabury's Age-In-Place program supports older adults in Washington, D.C.'s Wards 4, 5, and 6 through transformative volunteer service projects that help people stay in their own homes. Age-In-Place engages volunteers as a critical piece of the safety net in D.C. by providing yard work and housing cleaning services. Age-In-Place services are completely free for clients, which means the program supplies all tools and supplies. Our financial contribution will complement the volunteer component. An intergenerational group from First Church has volunteered with the program several times in the last several years.

Show Up for Racial Justice (SURJ)

SURJ (Showing Up for Racial Justice) DC is a chapter of the national SURJ organization, which seeks to organize white people to dismantle white supremacy and support racial justice movements. In DC, SURJ focuses on how to best support and follow the leadership of Black- and People of Color-Led organizing work, including Black Lives Matter-DC, the Stop Police Terror Project, Empower DC, and ONE DC. It also works on furthering their own political education and analysis, and connect with other white people interested in doing this work, canvassing, fundraising, and more.
