

Guest Preacher: Dr. David Lindsey



Rev. Dr. David B. Lindsey serves as the Executive Director of the Interfaith Council of Metropolitan Washington. Ordained in the UCC in 2003, David has served local churches in California, Minnesota, and Northern Virginia. He grew up Southern Baptist in Kentucky and Indiana at a time when that denomination was splitting. Finding himself spiritually homeless, David spent years studying a variety of world religions, particularly Tibetan Buddhism and Zen Buddhism. Still, he felt called to Christian ministry, so he finished his Bachelor's degree in theatre at Centre College (KY) and moved west to Claremont School of Theology in Southern California. There, he encountered the United Church of Christ for the first time. Outside of work, David and his wife Carrie ordinarily like to spend time travelling domestically and internationally. During the pandemic, most of their energy has been spent on creative projects at home, including David's lifelong interests in writing music and poetry. He and Carrie currently attend her Lutheran church online on Sunday mornings, then join the First Congregational service online. First Church was grateful to welcome David as a member in October, 2020.

Our November Second Sunday offering is dedicated to two organizations: **Through Piscataway Eyes** and **Strengthen the Church**, a special offering of the United Church of Christ.

Through Piscataway Eyes seeks to "enhance understanding of the Piscataway People as original Native People, Marylanders, and Americans by providing educational and interpretive opportunities regarding Piscataway culture in Southern Maryland." Their initiatives include a land trust, cultural center, housing assistance, and healthcare and education funds. Through this offering, we acknowledge the legacy and presence of the Piscataway

people in this area, and support them in carrying this heritage forward (you can read their detailed master plan [here](#)). During this month of Thanksgiving, we also acknowledge the loss this holiday represents to Indigenous Americans. You can read more about the real history of Thanksgiving in [this Smithsonian Magazine article](#), one of many resources to help us reflect on the sources and costs of white privilege and plenty in this nation.

The UCC's special offering, **Strengthen the Church**, supports new church starts, youth ministry, and innovative projects within local churches. Having previously received grant funding from STC for her new church start, Land of the Sky UCC, Rev. 



Welcome to First Congregational UCC. We were founded in 1865 by abolitionists as the first racially integrated church in Washington, D.C. In 1867 our mission committee played a prominent role in the founding of Howard University. The church has been located at its present site at 10th and G Streets NW since 1868. In more recent years, the church affirmed its vision as an Open and Affirming (ONA) Church (1987), a Just Peace Church (1985), and a Multiracial/Multicultural Church (2003). Our new building, constructed according to Gold LEED standards, was dedicated in 2012.

First Church continues to follow its faith journey into the future, and to be a prophetic voice for the Spirit in the nation's capital.
