

Music Notes by Eric and Robin Olson

"What a Wonderful World" was composed by George David Weiss and Bob Thiele, and recorded by Louis Armstrong in 1967. The sunny message was somewhat incongruous with the tumult of the 60's, but its simple, prayerful vision clearly resonated, as it became a standard. We think of it as a vision of Beloved Community, all the more poignant and compelling when performed amid all the troubles of our times. 1967 found the Olson brothers as young members of First Church, where along with supportive family, they were encouraged in their musical interests. They both grew up to pursue long careers in piano service, each being trained at Shenandoah University, and have lived lives full of music making. While at Shenandoah, Robin also received his degree in trombone performance, and has played in many local orchestras, brass ensembles, and bands. Eric enjoys playing several different instruments in a variety of genres.

If you have already reserved a ticket, Rev Sam will email them to you the week prior to the game.





In more recent years, the church affirmed its vision as an Open and Affirming (ONA) Church (1987), a Just Peace Church (1985), and a Multiracial/Multicultural Church (2003). Our new building, constructed according to Gold LEED standards, was dedicated in 2012. First Church continues to follow its faith journey into the future, and to be a prophetic voice for the Spirit in the nation's capital.
