Second Sunday Offering: Faith UCC Mobile Market

In November, First Church will take up a Second Sunday offering again for the Faith United Church of Christ Mobile Food Market, a ministry offering food to the community every third Thursday, from 9 a.m. until the food is gone.

Each month, more than 20 volunteers distribute free diapers and groceries to anyone in the community. To date, Faith UCC at 4900 Tenth St. NE has served over 1000 families in Ward 5 through the food market program.

In June 2022 alone, it served 374 households.

Faith UCC depends on donations from the National Capital Area Food Bank and from individuals and organizations like First Church and Ward 5 Mutual Aid. Let's give generously to help Faith UCC nourish our DC neighbors!

years, the church affirmed its vision as an Open and Affirming (ONA) Church (1987), a Just Peace Church (1985), Multiracial/Multicultural Church (2003), and an Anti-Racist Church (2021). Our new building, constructed according to Gold LEED standards, was dedicated in 2012. First Church continues to follow its faith journey into the future and to be a prophetic voice for the Spirit in the nation's capital.
