In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, magi from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? Olaiya's Cradle is a supportive, independent living program for homeless young mothers ages 18-21 and their children, for up to 18 months. Women are self-referred, and receive individual counseling, comprehensive maternal and infant health care, life skills training, education and career guidance, and child care support and parenting training to enable them to achieve self-sufficiency. Residents graduating from the program receive follow-up support and housing assistance to help them maintain stability. Olaiya's Cradle is a program run by Sasha Bruce

Youthwork, our partner in carrying out the Youth Drop In Center here at First Church for young adults who lack secure housing.

First Church continues to follow its faith journey into the future and to be a prophetic voice for the Spirit in the nation's capital.
