Today Following Worship: Community Potluck


Please join us upstairs in the Community Hall immediately following worship for our fall Community Potluck. Vegan and gluten-free options will be available. We encourage everyone to attend!

In more recent years, the church affirmed its vision as an Open and Affirming (ONA) Church (1987), a Just Peace Church (1985), Multiracial/Multicultural Church (2003), and an Anti-Racist Church (2021). Our new building, constructed according to Gold LEED standards, was dedicated in 2012. First Church continues to follow its faith journey into the future and to be a prophetic voice for the Spirit in the nation's capital.
